





Fig 1. Typical Output Characteristics




Fig 3. Typical Transfer Characteristics




Fig 5. Typical Capacitance vs. Drain-to-Source Voltage




Fig 2. Typical Output Characteristics




Fig 4. Normalized On-Resistance vs. Temperature




Fig 6. Typical Gate Charge vs. Gate-to-Source Voltage




Fig 7. Typical Source-to-Drain Diode Forward Voltage




Fig 9. Maximum Drain Current vs. Case Temperature




Fig 11. Typical Coss Stored Energy




Fig 8. Maximum Safe Operating Area




Fig 10. Drain-to-Source Breakdown Voltage




Fig 12. Maximum Avalanche Energy vs. Drain Current






Fig 13. Maximum Effective Transient Thermal Impedance, Junction-to-Case





Fig 14. Typical Avalanche Current vs. Pulsewidth



Notes on Repetitive Avalanche Curves , Figures 14, 15: (For further info, see AN-1005 at www.irf.com)

- 1. Avalanche failures assumption:
- Purely a thermal phenomenon and failure occurs at a temperature far in excess of Tjmax. This is validated for every part type.
- Safe operation in Avalanche is allowed as long as Tjmax is not exceeded.

Fig 15. Maximum Avalanche Energy vs. Temperature






Fig. 16 Threshold Voltage vs. Temperature




Fig 18. Typical Recovery Current vs. di_f/dt




Fig. 17 Typical Recovery Current vs. di_f/dt




Fig 19. Typical Stored Charge vs. di_f/dt




Fig 20. Typical Stored Charge vs. di_f/dt






Fig 21. Peak Diode Recovery dv/dt Test Circuit for N-Channel HEXFET® Power MOSFETs




Fig 22a. Unclamped Inductive Test Circuit




Fig 23a. Switching Time Test Circuit




Fig 24a. Gate Charge Test Circuit




Fig 22b. Unclamped Inductive Waveforms




Fig 23b. Switching Time Waveforms





Fig 24b. Gate Charge Waveform


